

A Plan Always Helps

PLANNING FOR A RETIREMENT, OR EXIT, FROM A COMPANY TAKES TIME ON YOUR PART AND THE COMPANY'S TO MAKE IT A SMOOTH TRANSITION

COMPLETE SUCCESS

FULL LINEUP OF UNDERGROUND SERVICES OFFERS CHANCE FOR VIRGINIA CONTRACTOR TO SERVE MORE CUSTOMERS WITH ALL THEIR NEEDS

When a company declares — in its name, no less — that it offers a "complete" line of services, expectations run high that it can do anything in a particular field. Complete Underground LLC is trying to live up to its name.


The Midlothian, Virginia, contractor offers directional drilling and plowing services for utilities, excavation on work sites and underground utility locating, pneumatic boring and duct bank and manhole installations.

Complete Underground is a busy company and Timothy Fortson, com-

pany vice president, wears many hats. His office is the cab of his pickup. He meets with customers, keeps a handle on day-to-day operations, over the years has "learned to mechanic a little bit" so he jumps in to repair equipment, and sometimes climbs in the operator's seat on a directional-drilling unit for an especially challenging bore.

The 35-year-old executive is partnered in the enterprise with his father, also named Timothy Fortson but with a different middle name. The senior

Fortson, who goes by Tim, owns the company. The vice president grew up around the drills and excavators of his father's company, went away to college for a year, and finally decided that his future lay underground, so to speak.

"I started out in the ditches," the son recalls about learning the trade as a younger man. "When I was younger and no one else was around I would jump on the machines to learn to operate them and watch the guys working them." By 2006-07, Tim Fortson was a committed underground contractor.


MAKING A NAME FOR THEMSELVES

In 2012, after a nationwide cable TV company operating in Virginia began to frustrate small contractors involved in the laying of cable, the Fortsons decided to make a clean break from the firm. They reimagined their business plan, emerged as a new company called Complete Underground, and today are working up and down the East Coast.

The Richmond market is the base of business, but "we'll work anywhere in Virginia, and do," says the vice president, "all the way across the state from the mountains to the beaches. In recent years, we haven't had to go out of state for work, but we will if the work warrants it. We've been fortunate. I really want to stay in the Mid-Atlantic region and build up our name."

Through the years, the company has dug into soils in Delaware, Maryland, North and South Carolina, and Florida. While it principally serves commercial clients wherever it digs, municipal utility departments have benefited from its work, and residential properties are not an uncommon destination for one of its rigs.

Fortson says directional drilling has always been the company's bread and butter. Complete Underground has six Vermeer HDD units, ranging from a model 16x20 to a larger 24x40 that the company recently used to bore an 18-inch hole 500 feet under a creek, dropping 30 feet at its deepest elevation before rising again. The company typically has three of the drills working on projects somewhere every day.



"We are pretty loyal to Vermeer," Fortson says. "All the brands have their own strengths and weaknesses,

but all our drills are Vermeer." So are

the company's plows. In its equipment yard are a Vermeer Flextrak 115, vintage 1998, a 750 quad track, a 1250 quad track and a 10-ton 1250i2 quad track with such features as a self-leveling cab.

"Everyone loves the quad tracks," he says, adding that there is a resurgence of interest in the plows. "They have come back into play in the industry. Ten years ago, it seemed to be something of the past. Now, we can't even find the plows we need, let alone the people to run them."

The company has four plows running every day somewhere in Virginia.

Other tools that Complete depends upon include Vivax-Metrotech utility and fiber multifrequency locators. The company recently purchased a Kubota

50 compact excavator and a 74 hp Bobcat T76 skid-steer that Fortson calls a Cadillac. "It rides smoother than any skid-steer I've ever been on," he says. "Another nice thing: Its engine compartment is wide open for servicing."

The company also has Grundomat pneumatic boring equipment in its toolbox. The cylindrical "missile" devices are utilized when a site is too confined for a drill unit and the bore hole is relatively small. "You can't do a real long shot, maybe 30 or 40 feet, but we can offer it to customers who need it," Fortson says.

When solid rock is the impediment to completing an HDD job, the company sometimes turns to an Inrock performance drilling tool. That was the case when the company was drilling under Hardware River south of Charlottesville for a fiber optic line. It began to bore in nice, yielding soil, but at the edge of the creek ran into rock.

"That was a difficult shot. We had to get our pitch just right before we drilled into the rock. There wasn't much steering at that point," Fortson says. Inrock engineers flew up from Houston to advise the Complete crew and stayed three or four days while the HDD unit reamed out a hole through the solid mass. "They were definitely a big help."

A challenging shot that Fortson recalls was a 500-foot bore with a 50-foot elevation change under another creek. No rock on that project, but the clay was memorable. "The material under the creek was nice and soft, but then I ran into some reactive clay," Fortson says. "I had to call our mud guys to help us with our mix so we could get our four 4-inch conduits pulled back. It was

the first time I'd encountered something like that. I was on the drill for that shot and it was one for the record books."

The "mud guys" or technicians were from Tarheel Contractors Supply out of Rock Hill, South Carolina.

ALL CONDITIONS, ALL WEATHER

Complete Underground tears into soil in the country and in the city, wherever the soil needs torn. "The guys do like being in the rural areas and predominantly right now we are in rural areas," says Fortson, "but we've done jobs in urban northern Virginia where you can't even find a piece of pavement without paint on it."

One urban memory is a job right there in Richmond that required open face cuts in a highly congested area. Drilling through the ground to install new lines was problematic because of many existing underground utilities. Over the course of a year, the crew installed miles of duct bank. The crew excavated an area where a duct bank was to be placed, assembled the receiving conduit with spacers between them, poured the concrete to form the "bank," refilled the hole, compacted

the soil and re-asphalted the paved area.

It was a Complete job in every sense of the word. It also was a hectic urban work site.

"Downtown Richmond drivers drive like crazy, and fast, too," Fortson says. "We had banners and signs and cones out there and one lady came right on through all of them and drove right into the ditch. Never a dull moment."

Virginia weather doesn't hamper the company's work as a rule, Fortson says. A winter storm periodically will disrupt drilling and trenching for a few days, but work goes on year-round. "For seven or eight years, we have been lucky to have big projects that we could keep working on right through the winter," he says.

FINDING LONG-TERM EMPLOYEES

Another element the company seems to be able to count on is employees who stick around. Fortson says if

someone hires on and stays a year, they are apt to still be there many years later. One long-timer has been employed by the family company since before the new company was formed. Numerous others have worked there for six to eight years.

"The majority of our guys have been with us for a while," Fortson says. "We're trying to get a younger generation in here, too, but that's tough. The new generation is hard to figure out."

A couple of long-term employees warrant special mention. Jed Erickson — the vice president sometimes refers to him as "Uncle Jed" — began working with Tim Fortson when they were still in Minnesota. Today, Erickson is director of operations. Another key employee, Jesus Nunez, is the lead

A Family Business

It is not unusual for a family to go back several generations in a particular trade. Complete Underground has that kind of heritage. It runs from Georgia to Florida to Minnesota before settling in Virginia.

When Tim Fortson graduated from an Athens, Georgia, high school in 1978, his father, George Thomas "GT" Fortson, took him under his wing. He decided his son should accompany him to Florida to find work. That's what they did in 1979.

There, the pair found jobs running cable TV lines around Miami. To help run the lines under paved sidewalks and driveways, GT Fortson used his welding skills to fabricate from an old lawn mower a kind of boring machine. It was an early precursor of today's sophisticated drilling technologies.

Then GT Fortson returned to Georgia. His son Tim stayed in Miami for a while before forsaking The Sunshine State for the Land of 10,000 Lakes — Minnesota. Finally, in 1983 — perhaps because he wasn't enamored of the colder weather — Fortson ventured south to settle in Richmond, Virginia.

There he continued to do underground work. His son, Timothy Patrick Fortson, came along and grew up around the trade work. In 2006, the son joined his father in the business. Six years later, they formed a new company, Complete Underground.

That's where we are today. The question is, will another generation of the family enter the trade someday and eventually run the family company? Too soon to say. Timothy Fortson's three children range in age from 2 to 8. Check back in 15-20 years.

direction drill foreman. He worked with the senior Fortson for nearly 30 years before leaving for a family job and then returning five years ago. Complete Underground Vice President Timothy Fortson takes pride in their small family business. His father, Tim, has owned the Virginiabased company for the last 10 years.

All this employee loyalty gives

the company the luxury of running five or six experienced crews. Crew members are cross-trained to some extent. About everyone can run a mini-excavator, for example, but there are HDD and plow specialists.

What's the vice president's favorite machine to operate? "I always liked the drill," Fortson says. "You can't see the work because it's all underground, so it's like a learning experience every time you get on it. We have a lot of different soils in Virginia, and you don't know everything about what's down there."

AN EYE ON GROWTH

Fortson doesn't know what the next decade is going to bring for Complete Underground. The immediate future looks good though. The company is finishing up an 80-mile installation of broadband fiber that Fortson hopes leads seamlessly to a second contract for an additional 500 miles of buried fiber optic. He also is attempting to broaden the company's involvement in the running of water, sewer and natural gas lines.

"And I'm trying to get more governmental contracts," Fortson says. "That's where I have been headed for the last six months."

Residential work seems to be slowing down from the pace of work the company enjoyed over the last couple of years. "Property owners aren't spending the money they have been," Fortson adds.

He believes the company is recognized by small and large customers alike as a good one to do business with, for two reasons. First is that its crews do high-quality work and do it quickly.

"Anywhere we go, when we roll in and start to work, customers can't believe how productive we are," Fortson says. "I push that with our guys, take pride



in the work we are doing, clean up as we are doing it. Generally, customers are amazed at how much we can get done."

The other selling point for Complete Underground, Fortson believes, is that it is a family company, rather than a conglomerate.

"We take a lot of pride in our name because everything we do comes back on us," he says. "I want us to grow, but I don't want us to be a national company or something. I want to offer the same quality services that bigger outfits offer and remain a family company, a more personal company, where people can ring up and I will pick up and answer. One of my goals is to at heart remain a small family company." \blacksquare

Proper Pairing

THREE THINGS CONTRACTORS SHOULD CONSIDER WHEN SELECTING A MINI STAND-ON SKID-STEER AND TRENCHER ATTACHMENT

ini stand-on skid-steers are valued for their versatility, and today one job that many utility and landscaping contractors are using these compact machines for is trenching.

With a quick and simple connection of a trencher attachment, a mini stand-on skid-steer can start digging out dirt and cutting through rocky soils

to support efficient installations of fiber, irrigation and other lines. And by using a single machine to do a wide range of jobs, you can reduce the number of machines you need to transport to and from job sites, while also simplifying training for operators.

However, there's a lot to consider when outfitting a mini stand-on skid-steer with a trencher attachment. For example, contractors should think about how their machine and attachment pairing can help address their

operational needs. Whether it's digging more efficiently, minimizing downtime, or getting more from their equipment to keep smaller crews efficient it's important to determine which machines and attachments can help operators boost their ROI and stay efficient.

Here are a few considerations when selecting a mini stand-on skid-steer and trencher attachment.

IDENTIFY THE JOB SITE AND PROJECT NEEDS

When considering renting or purchasing a mini stand-on skid-steer with a trencher attachment, contractors should first identify the full range of proj-

ects that their machine will support. This will help guide their decision on what specific machine and attachments are right.

Mini stand-on skid-steers are available with a range of power and performance capabilities. A 24 hp machine can suffice for small-trench jobs, where contractors may only need to dig 2 feet deep and 4 inches wide. But a more

powerful mini stand-on skid-steer, like a 37 hp option, can deliver more power to hydraulic attachments to help contractors increase productivity on trenching and other jobs.

When it comes to trencher attachments, machine manufacturers vary in what they offer. Some offer one trencher attachment for all their machines. Other manufacturers offer multiple trencher attachments that are designed to be paired with specific machines.

The latter approach lets contractors choose a trencher attachment that performs well with the machine that they've identified as the best fit for their job site. This is crucial when it comes time to start digging because if their machine



doesn't run a trencher chain at the right speed, it can lead to stalls and make trenching jobs less efficient.

When buying a trencher attachment, some contractors choose to go with a larger boom and use it for trenching at various depths. But this approach can create challenges. For example, trying to dig at 2 feet with a 4-foot boom can lead to workers guessing if they're trenching at the right depth, resulting in a lot of measuring, double-checking on the job site and unnecessary downtime. By using the right-sized boom, contractors can plunge it all the way and know they're trenching at the right depth.


BOOST PRODUCTIVITY FOR SMALLER CREWS

In today's tight labor market, easing work and improving comfort for contractors is more important than ever. Mini stand-on skid-steers can help ease the demands put on smaller crews in various aspects of their operations:

Training: A key benefit of using a mini stand-on skid-steer for trenching is its small learning curve. If a contractor's team is familiar with the machine and have used it for other functions, then they're already well on their way to knowing how to run it as a trencher. Additionally, trenching with a stand-on skid-steer helps improve efficiency by allowing operators to move in reverse, giving them a 360-degree view of the job site.

Operating: Improvements to hydraulic systems over the years have led to improvements in operator comfort with stand-on skid-steers. In the past, operating hydraulics may have felt like a feat of strength. But today's hydraulic systems allow users to move joysticks with minimal pressure. Some machine models also offer a choice of single- or double-joystick control, allowing users to choose the control method that they're the most comfortable with and efficient in operating.

Some machines offer color LCD displays with direct visibility into engine

diagnostics. And high-drive track systems with interchangeable bolton rollers can provide longer-lasting performance. On the trencher attachment, features like an 11-tooth forged sprocket can produce faster chain speeds and increased chain life, and

replaceable boom stubs can reduce both downtime and repair costs.

UNDERSTAND THE CONFIGURATIONS

Using good operating practices for mini stand-on skid-steers and their attachments can help operators stay productive and extend the life of their equipment.

Perhaps the simplest step workers can take is monitoring a trencher attachment's chain, teeth and sprockets for wear and tear. If the rollers start to look like an apple core or if the pin is visible, it's time to replace them. The same goes for a sprocket when its teeth start thinning.

Another area for workers to keep their eyes on is chain tension. Chains that become too tight can create wear on the sprocket or sidebars. On the other hand, chains that start sagging can vibrate the equipment and also cause wear.

Some manufacturers apply carbide to reinforce the strength of the trencher teeth. When that carbide begins to wear down to the base steel, the teeth can become worn, which can diminish machine efficiency, and risk breaking off. Crews should either immediately replace worn-down teeth or replace all the teeth together.

Workers should also make sure they use the appropriate teeth on trenchers for the ground conditions to help maximize both tool life and operator efficiency. For example, a cup tooth is designed to dig in soft and medium-type soils, while a shark tooth is well suited for breaking through harder soil. An alligator tooth is designed to chip away at and dig through rocky soil.

As always, local dealerships are often knowledgeable about local soil conditions and can help you set up your machine for success.

AN EFFICIENT AND EFFECTIVE PAIR

A mini stand-on skid-steer with a trencher attachment is a versatile solution to help meet a variety of job site needs. And when the right mini standon skid-steer is paired with the correct attachment, it can create an effective and efficient tool for trencher in landscaping and construction grade projects.

By using a single machine to do a wide range of jobs, operators can reduce the number of machines they need to transport to and from job sites, as well as enable contractors to take on more tasks even when working with a smaller crew.

Managing the Tax Impact

A QUALIFIED FINANCIAL EXPERT CAN WADE INTO THE INTRICACIES OF YOUR UTILITY CONSTRUCTION COMPANY TO FIND WAYS TO RAISE YOUR BOTTOM LINE

orporate taxes take a big bite out of small businesses. With today's high inflation rates and the threat of an economic recession, small-business owners are looking for every possible way to save money.

Is your business taking advantage of every tax break available? By reducing the corporate tax you owe, you'll keep more money in your pocket, making it easier to finance and grow your business. Roman Basi, attorney and certified public accountant at the Center for Financial, Legal and Tax Planning Inc. in Marion, Illinois, recommends a variety of strategies to save money on corporate taxes.

"What comes to the forefront is, 'How can they structure their company to save taxes?" he says.

When advising clients, one of the first things Basi checks is the legal and financial structure of a company. He performs a tax minimization analysis to compare the tax impact of different organizational structures. Tax classification varies, depending on the way an entity is organized.

For example, many small businesses form their legal entity as a limited liability company, S corporation or disregarded entity. The Internal Revenue Service taxes these entities through the owner's personal income tax form. All income and expenses flow to the business owner's 1040. Hence, these entities qualify for "flow-through taxation."

CHOOSING AN ADVISER

When it comes to business finances and taxation, a certified professional tax adviser simplifies the decision-making process. Basi recommends selecting a tax adviser who does more than just prepare tax returns and financial statements.

"I think it's crucial whenever you're dealing with tax law and tax advice to speak to someone that's not just a CPA but a tax attorney who specializes in the federal tax laws," he says. "They interpret what they see on the tax returns and financial statements as they relate to the tax code."

Another factor to consider when choosing a tax consultant is the size of the tax advisory service.

"They should seek out advisers that are similar in size to their company," Basi says. "Does a small, three-man operation want a 100-person law firm or accounting firm giving them advice? No. Their interests aren't aligned that way."

One of the benefits of working with tax advisers is their knowledge of current state and federal tax laws.

"There's nothing new that business owners absolutely need to know about right now. What they must know about is what's going to expire," Basi says.

CHANGING THE DESIGNATION

The business owner files an annual income tax return and a separate corporate tax return (if an S corporation) for the business yet the corporation pays no taxes. Although a flow-through taxation designation may yield the most favorable tax outcome, oftentimes it's worthwhile to consider alternatives.

The tax minimization analysis answers the question: What happens if we change this company to a C corpo-

ration, which is not a flow-through entity? Taxes are paid by the company instead of the business owner. To create a clear and understandable comparison, Basi's team develops a mock-up of financial statements showing the tax implications if the company switched to a C corporation. The tax minimization analysis considers alternatives to flow-through tax designation.

The results can be surprising. One of Basi's business clients with a flow-through tax designation was paying taxes at a rate of 37%. By restructuring the company as a C corp., the tax rate dropped to 21%.

"The tax minimization analysis goes a long way for small businesses," Basi says. The analysis especially is valuable for owners preparing to sell or transfer their business. Sellers want to maximize value and earn enough money to transition to a new career or enjoy their retirement. The analysis helps business owners make educated decisions based on financial data, not guesswork or gut instinct.



The most prominent tax legislation about to expire is the federal estate tax exemption, which sunsets at the end of 2025. Currently, a person can pass away and not pay any federal estate tax if they own up to \$12.06 million in assets, doubled to \$24.12 million if married. If Congress doesn't act on this legislation before it expires, the federal estate tax exemption reverts to \$5 million in total assets, adjusted for inflation (estimated to be \$6.6 million), but not doubled for married couples.

"There's been no discussion on whether it's going to be extended or not. People have to start planning," Basi says. Business owners should calculate what their assets are worth. If assets are above the federal estate tax exemption, they may end up paying 40% in federal estate tax. Additionally, state estate tax laws don't always align with the federal estate tax laws. As the end of 2025 draws closer, Basi recommends keeping an eye on federal and state estate tax exemptions.





HUNT FOR DEDUCTIONS

Another thing to keep an eye on are tax deductions. They lower a business entity's taxable income, so the business owes less to Uncle Sam.

One important deduction is the qualified business income deduction. The QBI prevents flow-through entities from paying taxes on 20% of their income. "Most business owners know that clause, but some do not. Some of them are not taking advantage of that," Basi says.

Another one of the most common tax deductions for small businesses is the meals deduction. Business meals are tax deductible. So, keep track of restaurant receipts and meal expenses for corporate events like employee picnics and holiday parties. Also track expenses for meals when traveling for business, entertaining a client or attending business conferences.

Mileage is another expense to track, both for fleet vehicles and private vehicles used for business purposes. The current standard business rate set by the IRS is 62.5 cents per mile. In addition to mileage, business owners can deduct the depreciation of work automobiles placed into service in 2022.

Small-business owners with a home office can claim their office as a tax deduction. Generally, only the portion of their home used exclusively and regularly for conducting business can be claimed. Additionally, the business owner can deduct certain expenses related to the home business, like utilities, rent, mortgage interest and insurance.

Tax credits also are available for retirement plan startup costs and solar energy project investments.

Finding ways to save money on taxes is worth the required time and energy. Taxation typically isn't always top-of-mind for busy utility workers who are focused on providing great customer service. That's why it pays to consult with a tax adviser who will look at tax law, tax deductions and tax credits to find all of the money-saving strategies available. By reducing the corporate tax you owe, you'll have more capital to invest in your business.
